### New Business

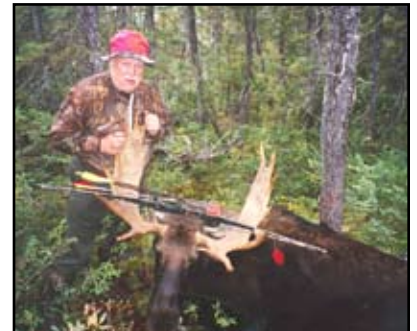

Under no circumstances are 3d targets to be shot prior to the start of the event. This practice is unsafe, and does not allow the club to collect appropriately for the use of the 3d targets. The club routinely places old 3d targets in the woods for members to shoot, free of charge. That will continue, but will be prohibited on days that paid events take place.
